This letter supports the grant application being prepared for the Wyoming Business Council's, Business Ready Community Grant program by the City of Laramie and the Laramie Economic Development Corporation to develop the Cirrus Sky Technology Park.

The concept of a research and technology park in Laramie is good and will help diversify and develop Wyoming's economy by providing a home for technology-related businesses. Pending approval by the University of Wyoming Trustees, UW plans to participate in the Cirrus Sky Technology Park through the early purchase of a parcel of land to develop the University's own research park.

Largely because of the presence of the University of Wyoming and its programs, Laramie is now the home of a vibrant and growing technology business sector. UW's Wyoming Technology Business Center has identified approximately 65 such businesses in Laramie, and the recent SNAPIT report (developed by the Laramie Economic Development Corporation with Wyoming Business Council funds) interviewed 34 of these companies. One of the issues these companies face is a place to grow. Laramie is acting like other technology hubs associated with research university communities with tech businesses remodeling older buildings in the downtown area, but there is at present, no location where these companies can develop their own building (or occupy spec buildings) in a technology area such as that which the Cirrus Sky Technology Park will provide.

Development of the Cirrus Sky Technology Park is a necessary step in the continued growth of Laramie's technology business sector and a needed addition to the growing synergy among NCAR, Microsoft, UW and small tech companies in Southeastern Wyoming. For these reasons the University of Wyoming supports the City/LEDC grant application.


I am writing to share my thoughts and support for the City of Laramie's Business Ready Community Grant known as the Cirrus Sky Tech Park.




