## Close the Loop!

Recycling is a good first step, but equally important is closing the recycling loop by buying products made with recycled materials. This provides the economic incentive for recyclers to continue their operations and for manufacturers to use recycled materials.

## What do those symbols mean?



The "Three Chasing Arrows" symbol means the product is made from recycled material and/or can be recycled. The product will indicate if only one of these is true.



The number in this symbol indicates from what type of plastic the product is made. Certain types of plastic are more commonly recycled than others. Numbers "1" and "2" are the most widely accepted for recycling.

## How to avoid having to dispose of hazardous waste:

Buy the least toxic product possible. There are a wide-variety of non-toxic and bio-degradeable products available today, from toiletries to cleaners. Starting off with a non-toxic product will eliminate worry about disposal and save time and money from cleaning contamination.

Buy only the quantity of product that you will use. By buying only what you will use and then using all of it, there will not be any waste to dispose of.

Recycle! Give unused paints, cleaners, chemicals, and other materials to someone who can use them. The Salvation Army will accept fairly new televisions and computers in working order.



## Benefits of Recycling

Aluminum: Four pounds of bauxite are saved for every pound of aluminum recycled (Reynolds Metal Co.)

Glass: One ton of glass made from 50% recycled materials saves 250 pounds of mining waste (Environmental Protection Agency)

Paper: Each ton of paper that is recycled saves 60 pounds of air pollution (Center for Ecological Technology)

Plastic: Two billion tons of plastic wouldn't go to landfills if America recycled every plastic container (The Pennsylvania State University)

Steel: Enough steel and iron is thrown away every year to supply the nation's automakers with all of their steel and iron needs (Steel Recycling Institute)

## Additional disposal methods:

Check the label! Follow the directions to determine proper disposal methods.

Paint: The best way to dispose of paint is to use it up. Add another coat of paint if you can. Otherwise, leave the can open in a well-ventilated area until it dries. Water-based paint dries faster and is less toxic than oil-based paint. Wrap the dried paint in newspaper and throw it in the trash.

Solvents: Reuse solvents such as paint thinner by allowing the solids to sink to the bottom, then draining the clear liquid into a well-marked container for reuse. Some solvent solids can be dried, wrapped in newspaper, and thrown away.

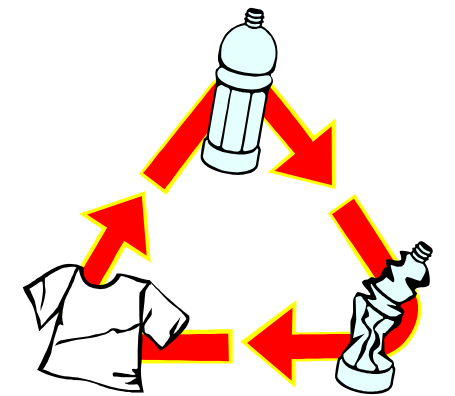
